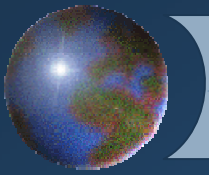
## Reflections on other UN Conventions: human rights

# Human Rights Protection Systems

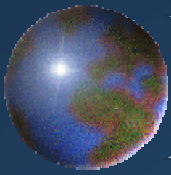

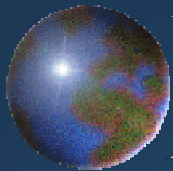

The ILO is working with the Government to help promote better communication between management and workers. Research has shown that dialogue is essential to increasing efficiency and improving production methods.

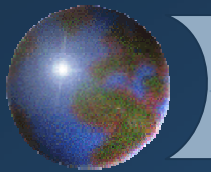


# *Better Factories Cambodia*



Higher education is often out of reach for families with modest incomes or that are mired in poverty. The provision of vocational training in marketable skills has had a positive impact on many people's economic livelihoods.

In collaboration with the Employers and Workers organisations, the ILO has assisted in the elimination of child labour from the textile sector.
